
## Reference: miscellaneous Scripture Pastor Larry Webb

Proverbs 24:3, "Through wisdom a house is built, and by understanding it is established:" **Definition**: A blended family exists where one or both members of the marriage have children from a \_\_\_\_\_\_ relationship or marriage. Biblical Example: \_\_\_\_\_ ONE... God has designed the husband and wife relationship to be the domestic arrangement. Reference: Matthew 19:6, "So then, they (the man and woman in marriage) are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together (in marriage) let not man separate." TWO... God designed the parent-child relationship to be a domestic arrangement. Reference: Genesis 2:24, "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh." Reference: **Proverbs 22:6**, "Train up a child in the way **he should go**, and when he is old he will not depart from it." THREE... Because the first two statements are true, the husband and wife relationship is therefore to be \_\_\_\_\_\_ over parent-child relationships. References: **Ephesians 5:22-33** then **6:1-4** Reference: I Timothy 3:4; Proverbs 16:2 (see screen)

Reference: Ephesians 6:1 and 2, "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. Honor your father and mother, which is the first commandment with promise."

There are four different classifications of child-centered parents (adopted from KID CEO, author Ed Young, Jr.)

- Parents
  These parents are committed to rescuing their child from problems and conflict.
- Parents
  These parents see their children as potential super-athletes.
- Parents
   These parents have a buddy system with their children.
- Parents
   These parents attempt to reason with their children and relate to them as little adults.

## Practical Action Steps to help Blended Families in Step-Partnering and Step-Parenting

1)	Commit to a household.  Reference: Joshua 24:15b, "but as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD."
2)	Establish biblical at the outset.
	Three reasons parents should establish house rules: Rules help maintain in the home. Reference: I Corinthians 14:40, "let all things be done decently and in order."
	Parents are to provide discipline. Reference: <b>Proverbs 29:15</b> , "The rod and rebuke give wisdom, but a child left to himself brings shame to his mother."
	Understanding what is acceptable and unacceptable makes life for both the children and the parents. Reference: Deuteronomy 12:28, "Observe and obey all these words which I command you, that it may go well with you and your children after you forever"
3)	Parental discussions should happen behind
	Reference: <b>Proverbs 22:15</b> (see screen)
4)	Parents always present a to the children (both biological and step-children).  Reference: Matthew 12:25b, "every city or house divided against itself will not stand."
5)	In areas of potential conflict, utilize4:1-3.  verse one, "I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called,"  verse two, "with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering bearing with one another in love,"  verse three, "endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."
6)	the marriage over the parent-child relationship.
